INSTRUCTIONS or suggestions as to how to conduct this study.

I can only suggest how this study was originally conducted and it was very successful. First of all, we tried to arrange a very informal atmosphere with the folks sitting in a loose circle. We would begin the session by having tea, or cokes and an informal time of fellowship. Then we would have a prayer time with everyone suggesting names of those for whom we should pray. It was also mentioned each session that we expected that each individual have at least one person for whom they would agree to pray for in regards to that person's salvation.

To actually begin the study the entire chapter would be read aloud with each one willing to read, taking the number of verses and dividing it by the number of people present and each one reading a portion.

Then the first one on the left (a habit of mine) would begin by reading the first question and giving their answer. The verse where their answer was found must also be given. Then the leader asks if everybody agrees. Let discussion carry on as necessary but not too long. Then go to the next question and the next person until all of the fifteen questions are answered.

For the discussion questions (numbers 16-17-18) each person present should give their answer once again going from the first one on the left and so on. Answer one question at a time, with each person present giving their reasons for their answer to each question. Discussion can be long or short depending on how the group feels. Do not carry the class session on too long.

Encourage each one to prepare his answers BEFORE the session begins if at all possible only because they will get more out of the discussion if they have thought about it.

3. We know that Paul was involved with the Christians at Corinth from the Book of Acts 18:19, but why is the name of Apollos mentioned? (See Acts 19 - when you answer)
4. Name the people who were baptized by Paul. Why so few? Who was Gaius? (See Introduction in Broadman Commentary)
5. Who looked for miraculous signs when Paul wrote this letter, and who looks for miraculous signs in our own day? In Matthew 12:38-39 how did Jesus respond to the Jews when they asked for a miraculous sign? How should we respond to those today who seek after a miraculous sign?
6. From what is written in this first chapter of 1 Corinthians, describe the Corinthians before they became Christians. See verses 26 and following.

QUESTIONS FOR FURTHER STUDY - 1 CORINTHIANS 5

1. What kind of sexual immorality was the man in Corinth guilty of?
2. What were they to do with this sexually immoral couple? Why is it dangerous in a church (congregation) to leave such behavior alone and not deal with it? Does it show pride on the part of the leaders? Does it show weakness on the part of the leaders? Should such an action be taken openly or privately? What if an innocent party is involved, such as a wife or husband who is not involved in the actions of the guilty couple?
3. Does Paul say in this letter that Christians should never associate with sinful people? If that is not what he meant, what precautions should we take when we associate with sinners in the world?

QUESTIONS FOR FURTHER STUDY - 1 CORINTHIANS CHAPTER 7

1. Is there any reason that you can think of as to why Paul would suggest that everyone should stay unmarried even though it is not sinful to get married?
2. Is the rule that Paul lays down in all churches in verse 17 an indication that Christianity was NOT to be a force for political change? Does that mean that no political or social change will be brought about by the force of Christianity?
3. What conditions alter the advice about divorce given in verses 10 and 11?
4. What are the verses 32 through 35 talking about in this chapter? Does this mean that if a man does something wrong and violates his fiancé and they go ahead and get married, this is alright with Paul?
5. What is the length of any marriage? If it is for life, does that mean that a man who was married for many years to one woman and she dies, then, if he marries another woman, that he is now unfit to be an elder? (See the qualifications for an elder in 1 Timothy 1:2 where it says that an overseer must be the husband of but one wife.) Does this mean that he MUST BE MARRIED?
